### What is a Livability Study?

Livability refers to the quality of life experienced by the people who live, work, and recreate in a community. In a transportation context, livability refers to improvements in public space that increase safety and access for all users of the transportation system. The livability study will conclude with a list of recommendations, which can include:

- Enhancing transportation safety;
- Improving driver signage;
- Improving pedestrian crossings and sidewalks;
- Making bus stops more accessible; and
- Improving the bicycle network;
- Incorporating Vision Zero recommendations.
- Making intersections safer;
